The theme for the day was to "honor our past and celebrate our future." Programs that included our club history were placed at every seat. The day started with a welcome by our President and included statements from our California District Representatives, the La Habra Mayor, and CFWC President. We also invited Orange District's Dean, Colleen, to give her famous membership program, Members are a Treasure. It was an interactive program and guests were left feeling the impact our members and they themselves can have on a community.

It didn't stop there we also recognized members in attendance who had 40, 50, and even 70 years of service in our organization.

We also invited our local high school's ukulele performing group and they provided wonderful entertainment. But what perhaps people talked about the most was the history we had presented at the event. We had a table that displayed over 125 years of service. Old membership yearbooks dating back to 1905, minutes and financial ledgers covering the 1920's, '30s and '40s. We displayed photos and played a video collage of photos during the event.
