**Project Title:** Secure the Call                      **Hours** 30                      **Donated \$** 10                      **In Kind** \$1280

The Tustin Area Woman's Club embarked on a meaningful project focused on the continuous collection of used cell phones and tablets to support "Secure the Call", a non-profit organization with a mission to refurbish and redistribute devices to over 400 community partners, senior citizen centers, Domestic Violence shelters, police, and sheriff departments. This initiative not only ensures that any cell phone can dial 911 without a service connection but also contributes to environmental sustainability by keeping old electronics out of landfills.

Our club actively engaged in the project by collecting old electronics from members and friends, as well as establish a collaborative effort with a collection box at the Tustin Historical Society. Over the span of March to August 2023, our dedicated members managed the collection activities, successfully shipping a dozen devices to "Secure the Call." This collaborative effort showcased the Tustin Area Woman's Club's commitment to making a positive impact and highlighted our role in facilitating the end goal of providing essential communication tools to various community organizations.
