Our gatherings not only keep the joy of reading alive but also create a space where members can share their insights and experiences, proving that the power of a book is as vibrant as ever.

For the past seventeen years the ESO club section has seen one chairman, and a continuing membership of 14. True, due to death and members moving away, we have lost some members, but each year a few new members join and many claim it is one of the most relaxing things they do. Once a month the meetings held bring the members together to share what they have read. They donate the books read and in order to expand reading interest in our club this ESO chairman takes those books to the general club meeting and offers them free of charge to anyone interested. The one or two books left after the meeting ends are then donated to the local library to sell in their book nook. Other club members added to our library donation and a total of 98 hard bound books, 109 paperbacks and 55 children's books and 10 books on CD were donated to the local library.

This fall we learned of the veteran's hospital women's reading group. They all read the same book each month. The hospital provides the books and were looking for sponsors to help them buy books for some of the members who could not buy them. The ESO members requested \$150 from the club budget to donate to this worthy cause.

This year each member read an average of 18 books per month or about 2,808 books for the year for the 14 members. Most members reported reading one to two hours daily totaling some 10,220 hours per year for the entire reading group.
