As President, my theme, "Supporting the Most Vulnerable Members of Our Community," reflects the heart of our Club's mission to make a meaningful impact. Inspired by the guidance and motivation of the GFWC, we chose to support a local adaptive martial arts program for children and adults with intellectual and physical disabilities—a cause deeply personal to me, as my autistic son has flourished in this program for many years. Together, our Club raised \$4,500 to fund scholarships for students in need, provide new belts and gis, and purchase essential training equipment for the studio. The unwavering support and framework of the GFWC propelled this initiative, uniting our members with a shared purpose and drive. PROJECT TITLE: National Day of Service Hours Donated: In Kind: .

As part of the GFWC National Day of Service on September 27th, members of the Women's Club of Cypress, led by our President and joined by her two children, volunteered at Second Harvest Food Bank of Orange County's farm in Irvine. Together with other volunteers, we harvested thousands of pounds of zucchini and vellow squash destined for food banks, shelters, schools, and volunteer kitchens across the county. Meeting in the early hours, we received training before pairing up in the fields, experiencing the farming process firsthand while working toward a shared mission of combating food insecurity. The program is entirely volunteer-driven, and the experience left us with a deep appreciation for the hard work and dedication required to provide fresh, nutritious produce to those in need. Despite the sore backs, legs, and feet, the joy of knowing our efforts would directly benefit families and individuals in our community was immensely rewarding. In addition, members who were unable to join the harvesting effort demonstrated their support by donating to the Cypress College Food Bank. These contributions helped address food insecurity among college students, ensuring they have access to nutritious meals as they focus on their education. This dual effort exemplifies the Women's Club of Cypress's commitment to service and supporting our broader community in meaningful ways. The Women's Club is dedicated to making the partnership with Second Harvest Food Bank a recurring event and expanding our outreach to other local food programs. Project Title: Night Section Successes Hours Donated In Kind

We usually hold a potluck and one of our club members offers up her home for these special meetings. In July one member hosted a Christmas in July fundraiser in her backyard to benefit Royal Family Kids Camp, a special once a year camp for children in foster care. Members donated money and assembled birthday presents for the kids at camp. The host member held a fun Christmas themed game, and the nearly 30 participants brought foods and beverages to share. The night concluded with an outdoor showing of a new Hallmark Christmas movie. In December another member hosted around 60 club members and spouses at her home for a potluck, this time members were asked to bring a \$20 value unwrapped toy to be donated to the CHPs for Kids program. We played a fun game based on holiday carols, and ended up gathering \$1,200 worth of toys which were delivered by two members the following Saturday. Night Sections are a fun way to get club members together in a different, less formal setting. Our Night Sections are so successful because of the generous members willing to open their homes and because of the special bond our members share. We have so much fun together, and it is contagious.
