Members bought items to fill the goodie bags and assembled the bags together. The members met at Ballpark Pizza to assemble the goody bags, where we were also having a dine out night. The restaurant had enough tables for us to assemble the goody bags and promote our club giveback night at the same time*. Then some members met up in costume and some with their own children, at the library party and helped distribute the goodie bags to children that attended the event. Over 150 bags were assembled for this event.

Project Title BACK TO SCHOOL DRIVE **Hours** 35 **Donated \$** 0 **In Kind \$** 250

The San Clemente Junior Woman's Club was contacted by a local Elementary school that was organizing a "Sponsor A Student" drive for 30 children identified as unhoused, or with limited resources, and in need of basic items for the upcoming school year. The club decided to sponsor two girls at the school and members purchased items on the list of things they needed. Such as shoes, clothing, uniform pants, undergarments, socks, water bottles, and hygienic products for each of the girls. This project was especially unique for our small club, because it was not only one of the fastest to complete within short notice, but it was also during our off season and not a collection drive that we've done before.
