At the core of our efforts is a strong scholarship program, offering support to local students pursuing higher education and vocational training. Our commitment extends beyond academics, as we partner with other organizations to address the pressing needs of displaced teens, seniors, veterans, and animals. By fostering strong relationships with sister clubs, and city-wide philanthropic entities we amplify the impact of our work, demonstrating the power of collaboration in driving meaningful change within our community.

Project Title: Tustin Area Woman's Scholarships	Hours <u>240</u>	Donated \$8,000_	_In Kind

Tustin Area Woman's Club (TAWC) awarded eight \$1,000 scholarships in 2024. The purpose of each Scholarship is to recognize two outstanding female seniors from each of the four Tustin Unified School District High Schools (TUSD). The scholarship money is to be used exclusively for educational purposes at the accredited institution of higher education in which the student attends directly after high school. In January each of the five TUSD high schools was provided with application materials which were made available to all students attending that high school. A TAWC representative worked directly with the high school counselors to answer questions and ensure the applications were accessible and completed in a timely manner. Completed application packages were picked up by the TAWC representative in the early spring. A total of 35 applications were received and each was read by all five of the TAWC Scholarship Committee members. A thoughtful and thorough review of each application was performed by each Scholarship Committee member. The Committee determined the winners using criteria which included: demonstrated commitment to academic studies, community service, clearly articulated plans for the future and potential for future success. The individuals selected were presented their scholarship materials at each high school's awards ceremony by a TAWC representative.

Calculations for Hours: 240 hours

80 hours Committee Chair (Sheryl Franke) – Update application materials, provide to all high schools, conduct meetings with Scholarship Committee (intro meeting, evaluation meeting), review all applications, participate in evaluation discussions, communicate information to winners, present winners with certificates and award letters, maintain schedule of awards, validate proof of enrollment from award winners, work with TAWC Treasurer, write TAWC report.

160 hours Committee Members (Barbara Swancoat, Marjorie Davis, Barbara Grider, Kelly Felton): Attend Scholarship Committee meetings (2), pick up scholarship applications from assigned high school, review

application packages and flag any missing items/communicate with counselor, review all applications, attend High School awards assemblies. 40 hours x 4 people = 160 hours

Project Title: Dino Dash Runner's Circle Hours 4 Donated \$400\_ In Kind

The Tustin Public Schools Foundation envisions a great education for every student in the Tustin Unified School District (TUSD). As a non-profit organization made up of community volunteers who raise money and then fund programs and materials that enhance the educational experiences of TUSD students, they work with the community to help reach, teach and inspire Tustin Unified students. All monies go to the Tustin Unified Schools to provide additional educational tools and equipment.
