Tara's Chance combines the physical benefits of horsemanship with an emotional connection to Provide equine therapy. Learning to ride a horse requires balance and coordination and many Disabled children lack muscle tone. Equine therapy gives a disabled child a physically enjoyable experience that helps develop these skills.

The program was in need of a new smaller horse and the club purchased a horse (Jack) for \$5,000. The club also donated \$3,500 toward the program.

Project Title **Habitat for Humanity** Hours 6 Donated \$ 438.00 In Kind \$ \_\_\_\_\_

Habitat for Humanity is the District President's Project and as such club was asked to support the project. The club 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President purchased a large wooden house and each month it is passed around through the membership. The club members donated \$188 and the club donated \$250.
