Report writing season is upon us. Remember our reporting year is January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020. This has been such a crazy year, who remembers what happened last January and February? It's time to pull our minutes and newsletters and gather all the information about all the wonderful things your club did during this last year.

Find the report form by going to the <u>CFWCornagedistrict.com</u> web site and select the reports tab. From the list select Statistical Report and the Club Award Entry Form (narrative form). The report forms from the web site are interactive. However you must save them first into your word documents so you can edit the report and complete it on line.

#### Statistical report is required!

Your club may choose not to write a narrative report but the **statistical report is required**. Statistical reports reflect the **hours spent, dollars and in-kind donations made** as well as how many members were involved in each and every activity your club has held.

#### When writing your Statistical Reports remember to include:

- The hours spent in meetings, all meetings including GFWC, CFWC Orange District and club meetings
- Hours spent in preparations
- Miles driving to and from
- Hours spent on projects and committees
- Hours spent in delivering monetary and in-kind donations

#### **Affiliate Organizations Data**

- This is a new section at the bottom of the statistical report form.
- This new section will provide information specific to each affiliate organization.
- The national totals received by GFWC will be shared with each affiliate organization to demonstrate service by GFWC clubwomen.

Protect Funding for Victims of Crime

The Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) grants provide federal funding that enables local organizations serving survivors of domestic violence, child abuse, sexual assault, trafficking, and other crimes to provide counseling, case management, crisis hotlines, emergency shelters, and other community-based programs. Congress is finalizing its FY2021 Appropriations Bills and substantial funding cuts to VOCA are being considered, as is language to fix the formula and stabilize the Crime Victims Fund.

The VOCA formula must be fixed to avoid further financial crisis and the elimination of services. Congress must bolster the Crime Victims fund by ensuring federal financial penalties from deferred prosecution and non-prosecution agreements are deposited into the Crime Victims Fund and used to serve victims of crime.

We are asking you to contact your members of Congress immediately. Congress has an opportunity to save victim service grants by stabilizing the Crime Victims Fund. It is important that you act now. <u>Write to your Senators and Representatives today!</u>
