The San Clemente Junior Woman's Club (SCJWC) held a birthday dinner on February 10, 2020 during the general meeting to celebrate the club's 72nd birthday and honor past presidents. The theme was Kate Spade Glam Party to tie in with our 20's theme Gala. Members and past presidents werein attendance. Invitations were mailed to past presidents and special guests by coordinating with the correspondence secretary to receive an updated list of addresses.

For the decor, we pulled together our resources and borrowed items from members to save costs on the event. Federation got crafty and made many of the decorations including custom table runners, gold spray painted recycled wine bottles with ribbon and flowers, and gold picture frames with quotes and flowers that we used as centerpieces. The wine bottles were saved (recycled) by members and spray-painted gold, and the gold frames were purchased from the dollar store and then refurbished. To add to the ambiance, Federation added a photo wall at the entrance to take photos. To

keep guests entertained and to break the ice, Federation led a series of games including "guess the number of candy" at the check-in station, "what's in your purse" and "pass the prize". For dinner, we did a mix of catered food and member donation/potluck. For the catered food we ordered from Café Rae. For the remainder members signed up to bring drinks, wines, bread rolls, desserts, and appetizers. We continue the tradition of presenting each former President a bouquet of carnations and baby's breath. To tie in with the theme we used the same ribbon as the wine bottles centerpieces.

And Birthday Dinner would not be a Birthday Dinner without a raffle! A raffle bucket was passed around to everyone. Each president and special guest were given a special raffle ticket when they signed in. As part of our fundraising, we raffled off 15 donated gifts and sold the table centerpieces to bring in over \$100 to the club.

One of the Club's favorite Federation projects- Secret Sister! Members sign up by filling out an online questionnaire created on Survey Monkey. Questions include general contact information, likes, and dislikes, and lists of favorite things and places to help the members get to know one another. Federation semi-randomly assigns members to deliver gifts to one another and emailed each with the name and responses for their paired secret sister.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic this year we made the gifts a delivery only method. Members had the opportunity to send gifts to their secret sister by delivery or secretly dropping off at each other's doors. Many members got creative, by texting federation to alert their secret sister their gift had arrived to dropping off a series of gifts to open each day as a countdown to the reveal. Members were given the opportunity to provide as many gifts as they would like during a one-month period between Nov-Dec, with the reveal occurring during our December holiday meeting.

Engaging and connecting our members through the COVID-19 pandemic was not an easy feat. The pandemic brought new challenges of finding creative ways to keep our club motivated to get together virtually during a time when face to face interaction was not possible. In an effort to reengage and re-connect, federation set up a both a fundraiser and wine tasting event to bring our members together. In the weeks leading up to the event, SCJWC set up a fundraiser with One Hope Wine, where twenty percent of the proceeds went back to the club. This event brought in \$115.49! Members were encouraged to purchase wine from One Hope to be enjoyed during our virtual wine tasting and membership drive. The event was a success with one prospective individual and 7 members from the club joining in via zoom. The event included a bingo game with informative information on different wines as well as a great night of conversation and catching up with each other.
