Project Title: Support City Council Hours: 50 Donated \$ 0 In-Kind \$ 200

Over the year, several members attended events hosted by Fullerton City Council members and discussed issues of importance to our club and community such as the Hillcrest Park completion. There have been many renovations done including the "Pine Forest Stairs" (a collection of seven-foot wide timber stairs) which attract many to come out and exercise. We also participated in a school supply drive started by a Fullerton City Council member to get the community involved in children of the Garnet District, an area in Fullerton know for drugs, alcoholism, and gangs. The school supplies collected would be given to the students of the schools in this area.
