California fires have burned 3.2 million acres, an area almost the size of Connecticut. Therefore Penny Pines is an urgent project for us. Dori Kelsey, our past CA president, reported that this past year we sent \$30,000 covering 441 acres but we must continue to do more. Keep collecting money and send it when the office opens again. Also, GFWC reported that 28,783 trees were planted in 2019 to satisfy one of the Seven Grand Initiatives. In all, conservation efforts by the entire nation consisted of 14,100 projects, 745,032 volunteer hours, \$1,331,953.10 were donated and \$1,695.183.20 in-kind donations. Amazing statistics and we say thank you because your efforts have made a difference. **PENNY PINES**


