This year the club was contacted by the Fullerton High School Academy of the Arts Teachers and a wish list was provided to the club. The club donated \$4,500 to assist the students to travel to a college admission audition. One student received a full scholarship and received 11 offers. Not forgetting the other arts \$2,500 was donated to purchase cameras and \$200 for visual arts equipment.

The club also donated \$500 to the CFWC Young Musician Contest.
