Conservation

 The Woman's Club of Fullerton is an organization full of pride and history. We are extremely proud of the fact that we have been in operation since November of 1902. Our mission is dedicated to uniting women of all ages for community service, supporting charitable organizations, fostering friendships and empowering women through learning about the community around us. The Woman's Club of Fullerton resides in a city of 135,161 community members. Since our 2007 rebirth, we have grown to 60 members and growing.

Project Title: Woodcrest School Garden Hours: 40 Donation \$ 0 In-Kind \$ 70

On February 20, 1919 The Woman's Club of Fullerton went to assist Woodcrest School to plant a school garden. The members along with children ages 6-11 cleaned the vegetable beds. The members showed them how to pull out the weeds and loosen the soil for replanting, and to clean up the debris. With the help of our members, the faculty and students will raise funds for maintaining the raised beds and students will bring the garden from seedlings to a full grown crop. Our Members and children planted vegetables like artichokes, tomatoes, strawberries and herbs like basil and spearmint. They chose short season vegetables and herbs so the children could harvest the garden during the school year. The children were so enthusiastic; they loved digging in the soil and finding earthworms, loosening the soil to plant the seedlings and seeds to the right depth. This was a big hit with the kids! It was so much fun to see the determined and fierce faces they made while planting.

Project Title: Woodcrest Park Groundbreaking Hours: 15 Donated \$ 0 In-Kind \$ 0

On February 19, 2019 the Mayor of Fullerton and Council Members along with the Parks and Recreation Director and Woman's Club of Fullerton members as well as many of the neighborhood parents were at the Ground Breaking Ceremony at the Woodcrest Park in Fullerton. This signaled the beginning of the Renovation of the Park which has been much anticipated. Woman's Club of Fullerton has been a constant supporter of the Woodcrest Park for the past 3 years and was so excited that our efforts were finally coming to fruition. All those involved put on a safety hat and used a shovel to dig into a mound of soil and turn it over. The Grand Opening was scheduled in December.

Project Title: Woodcrest Park Check Presentation Hours: 15 Donated \$ 2,000 In-Kind \$ 0

On April 16, 2019 The Woman's Club of Fullerton led by the Club's Conservation Chair were excited to attend the Fullerton City Council Meeting to present to the Mayor and Council Members a check for \$2,000 for landscaping to beautify the Woodcrest Park. This is a project the Club was so happy to contribute for plants and shrubs.

Project Title: Woodcrest Park Ribbon Cutting Hours: 300 Donated \$ 9,700.00 In-Kind \$ 0

On Saturday, December 14, 2019, the long-awaited ribbon cutting for Woodcrest Park in Fullerton took place. Six Woman's Club of Fullerton Members were in attendance to see this long-awaited project completed. In 2014, club members met with the Woodcrest Community group led by Habitat for Humanity about the needs at Woodcrest Park. After many meetings between WCOF, Kiwanis and the city of Fullerton, the city decided to do a complete renovation of Woodcrest Park. Along with WCOF, the Kiwanis joined us in the efforts by helping fund playground equipment for the park.

This project was completed in December 2019. Along with the ribbon cutting there was also a community celebration. WCOF had a booth and their sponsor Subaru brought a car for display. The City of Fullerton acknowledged the Woman's Club of Fullerton's efforts at the ribbon cutting ceremony. WCOF contributed a total of \$9,700.00 towards the park, along with hosting UP With People performers raising money for the park. WCOF also got Enterprise Car Rental to provide six weeks of free use of a car for the advance Up with People team in addition. This renovation has been long awaited and we are honored to have been able to contribute to this beautiful renovation.

Project Title: Subaru Dog Adoption Hours: 50 Donated \$ 0 In-Kind \$ 0

Ocean Subaru and Petember Animal Rescue partnered together for a Dog Adoption Event on Saturday October 26, 2019. The Woman's Club of Fullerton was there to support the event. Petember is a Charitable Non-Profit organization that rescues large and small animals. Petember brought 26 dogs of

Various sizes for adoption and 4 vans to provide free dog shampoos to the public. When the event ended, 22 dogs had been adopted and only 4 dogs remained. Subaru also provided a Hot Dog Food Truck, which served chili-cheese dogs and hot dogs served with tater tots. Delicious! The hot dogs sold out! It was so heartwarming to see the dogs being adopted. We will support this event again.

Project Title: Wands for Wildlife Hours: 20 Donated \$ 100 In-Kind \$ 50

For the past year, Wands for Wildlife has been one of our President's focuses. Wands for Wildlife is a rehabilitation organization in North Carolina that uses old mascara wands to remove fly eggs and larva from the fur and feathers of wild animals. The animals are so small that the wands work perfectly without hurting them. Our members have been collecting the wands, and then they are washed before sending them off to North Carolina. This is a collection to be done with ease as most of us use mascara and instead of just throwing them away in the trash, they are recycled and used for a purpose. We believe more people can get involved with this great organization.

Project Title: Barks of Love Hours: 30 Donated \$ 2,000 In-Kind \$ 0

On September 9, 2019, we invited a representative from Barks of Love, which is an all-breed dog, foster-based rescue in Orange County, CA that matches the perfect dogs with their perfect families. They are a 100% No Kill shelter! The Woman's Club of Fullerton presented Barks of Love with a check for \$1,500, which helps to pay for any illnesses or surgeries of the dogs that are being fostered. Along with the check we also donated a variety of dog items including kennels, lots of dog toys, leashes, collars, many blankets and gift cards to PETSMAART. We even enjoyed a visit from one of their furry friends, which all the members doted over. We were so honored that we were able to help this great organization.

Project Title: Elephants Ambo and Malima Hours: 0 Donated \$ 100 In-Kind \$ 0

The Woman's Club of Fullerton adopted Ambo, an orphaned baby elephant from the David Sheldon Wildlife in 2016. In 2017, we adopted another orphaned baby elephant, Malima at the age of 10 months.
