For decorations: We decided on a tea party theme. To save costs to the club we pulled resources together from many members to borrow decorations for the event. Our main decorations were handmade tea-cup flower bouquets that were used as centerpieces. The teacups mainly came from thrift store finds and some donations from members. In between the flowers we arranged tiered platters with yummy desserts on each table. Questions include general contact information, likes and dislikes, and lists of favorite things and places to help the members get to know one another. Federation semi-randomly assigns members to bring gifts to one another and emailed each with the name and responses for their paired secret sister.

Members were asked to bring their gifts for three months with the first two months being anonymous and the last month an in person exchange. Members brought gifts to the general meetings in each of the three months (October, November, and December with the "reveal in December at installation dinner"). Some members sent or dropped off gifts anonymously to their secret sister's house before the meetings. We encouraged members to give their gifts either before or at the meetings (not after) gifts brought to the meetings were distributed at the end of the meeting during extended federation time as to not disrupt the flow of the meeting.
