Public Issues

The Ebell Club of Fullerton was established in 1917, and shares the community with not only other community service clubs but also with another federated club. Until recently the club owned its own clubhouse and with the sale of the clubhouse while it was profitable it also caused an identity problem as many thought the club had dissolved with the sale.

The City of Fullerton is an established community with minimal new growth. With the funds now available from the sale of the clubhouse, the club's goals are to continue to become more visible, attract new members and contributed more significantly to the community.

Project Title Pink Fire Truck Hours 2 Donated \$ 3,000 In Kind \$ 150

The Ebell Club of Fullerton sponsors the Fullerton Firefighters Association "Pink Fire Truck" Project. A fire truck is covered in vinyl giving it a pink theme at a cost of \$3,000. The "Pink Fire Truck" is to help develop awareness of cancer during the month of October. Firemen volunteer their time to take the truck to different events where anyone can write a message on the truck. T-Shirts, hats and other items are also sold and this year they had a firemen calendar.

All funds raised go toward sponsoring someone's expenses in fighting cancer. This was the fourth year our club has supported this project and we are especially proud because the words "Wrapped with Love by the Ebell Club of Fullerton" are written on the side of the truck.

Project Title Police Department Hours 25 Donated \$ 4,500 In Kind \$ 250

The Police Department has come to know and count on the club and we are very pleased with this relationship. This year was no exception. The RSVP Program was in need of a sponsor for their annual volunteer Christmas luncheon.. Their request was for \$1,500 so that the volunteers would not have to pay for their own lunches.

The police department has two special programs during the Christmas season. "Shop with a Cop" is a program designed to build relationships with children in need. Each child receives a \$100 gift certificate and a policeman takes the child shopping. Approximately 15-20 children are involved with this program.

The other program is the "Adopt a Family" program where approximately 20 needy families are invited to the police station for breakfast and all members of the family receive presents, visit Santa and have breakfast. Fifteen hundred dollars was donated for each of these projects.

One member was able to have a 6 foot live Christmas tree donated, ornaments were purchased and members decorated the tree at the police station where these programs are held.

Project Title Love Fullerton Hours 2 Donated\$ 2,500 In Kind \$
The City of Fullerton designates one day as "Love Fullerton". Organized by the Chief of Police and a local volunteer, this day is set to repair, restore, update schools, homes, buildings, etc. in the City. Hundreds of volunteers come together to work on whatever needs to be done and the club donated \$2,500 to help cover the cost of supplies.

Project Title Coupons for Veterans Hours 50 Donated\$ In Kind \$1,040
Members of our club collect coupons and clip and sort them for use by the veterans overseas. Over the year approximately \$5,200 face value of coupons were sent.

Project Title American Legion Hours 10 Donated\$ 50 In Kind \$
The club members help distribute the crosses on the veteran's graves on Memorial Day and \$50 was donated to help with the expenses of the Memorial Day Services.

Project Title Honor Flight Hours 2 Donated\$ 2,000 In Kind \$
After attending a program on the Honor Flight Southland the club decided that this was in deed a valuable program and donated \$2,000 to help the veterans travel to Washington D.C. to view The memorials in their honor.

Project Title Patriotic Service Dogs Hours 2 Donated\$ 500 In Kind \$
The Patriotic Service Dogs which matches veterans with companion dogs to help with their Disabilities has been proven to be a very worthwhile project.
