*The San Clemente Junior Woman's Club, established in 1948, is a medium club (25 members) located in the beachside community of San Clemente, CA. Members range in age from 20's through 50's. We are a diverse group of women, most of us with children and many with professional careers, and all with a passion to serve our community.*

The SCJWC partnered with the city of San Clemente to run our annual "Project Angel Tree". This project really involves our entire community. Local schools made ornaments for our angel tree. We partnered with 5 local charities that gave us specific gift wishes for children, adults, and homebound seniors. We place the wishes on the back of the ornaments and hang them on two Christmas trees in San Clemente – one in the Community Center and the other in the Aquatic's center. People from the community were able to take an ornament, purchase and wrap the gift, and return it to either location. The club then distributed those gifts back to the originating organizations. We provided nearly 400 gifts through this program. The community and Juniors provided the remainder of the gifts. Our beneficiaries were: Boys & Girls Club, Family Assistance Ministries, Laura's House (abused women and children), the RIO Adult Day Health Care Center (developmentally disabled adults), and the San Clemente Senior Center.

Additionally, to increase community participation we made various "digital" Angel Trees on our Facebook page and on Amazon. We were able to increase the number of individuals who participated and bought gifts by posting the wishes online. Many individuals ordered gifts online and had them shipped directly to a Clubmember's address. Further, we accepted cash donations and gift cards online and used them to purchase gifts to fulfill wishes.

The San Clemente Junior Woman's Club adopted 3 local families in need by providing a full Thanksgiving meal, Turkeys and all of the fixings. All of the families that were chosen included children. Members donated all the food items, plus extra pantry items, and gift cards to local supermarkets. The adopt-a-family program is run by a local food bank called Family Assistance Ministries. Members and their children delivered the food to the families before Thanksgiving so they had time to cook and prepare their Thanksgiving dinners before the holiday. The families were very appreciative and it was a great feeling to help families in need during the holidays.
