Project Title: <u>Mascara Wands</u> Hours: <u>10</u> <u>Donated:</u> <u>\$</u> In Kind: <u>\$35</u> The San Clemente Junior Woman's Club collected used mascara wands in 2020 for the Appalachian Wildlife Refuge. Members cleaned the wands and mailed them to the Refuge. Old mascara wands are used to remove fly eggs and larva from the fur and feathers of wild animals. They work great because the bristles are close together. The club was able to gather wands from members and lash salons in San Clemente

Project Title: <u>Coastal Clean Up</u> Hours: <u>5</u> Donated: <u>\$</u> In Kind: <u>\$</u> The San Clemente Junior Woman's Club participated in the California Coastal Commission's clean up program. Due to COVID-19 the Coastal Clean-up Day was a little different this year. Rather than a specific day it was a month-long event. Clean-up Day is the highlight of the California Coastal Commission's year-round Adopt-A-Beach Program and is billed as the "world's largest garbage collection." Because of safety concerns there was no single day or centrally organized sites this year. Instead, cleanups were self-guided and close to home on any day or days in September of our choosing. SCJWC participated by sharing out to our community via our social media pages and encouraging our members to participate in this socially safe and distanced project.
