## Project Title: SPRING SPECTACULATOR

 Hours 13 Donated \$ $\qquad$ In Kind \$ $\qquad$Each year the City of San Clemente holds a Sensational Springtacular event for the children around Easter. The Juniors volunteer each year to help at one of the booths. On April 16, 2022, the club volunteered to host the Springtacular egg hunt section where we assisted the children in the easter egg hunt. The members look forward to this event to increase the visibility of the club and have fun with the children.

## Project Title: KIVA LOAN INTERNATIONAL_Hours 12 Donated \$ $\underline{200}$ In Kind \$___

Since 2014 the Juniors have been supporting and helping women internationally through the KIVA loan program. KIVA is an international nonprofit with a mission to expand financial access to help underserved communities thrive. The Juniors chose loans to women who are the primary source of income in their household where they can expand, invest in equipment, and purchase supplies for their business. Denise researches the type of loan, total loan amount requested, repayment timeline, country loan is going to, and risk factors such as currency exchange loss and loan risk rating. She then narrows it down to 2-3 women and presents them to the club.

During 2022 the dean, Denise Jusko, extended loans to 3 women as funds became available to the club. She chose 2 women in Ecuador to help them withstand the negative impacts of Covid 19 and 1 woman who is a single mother in El Salvador that supports her household. All loans were to buy feed, medicine, chickens or pigs for their farms. Two of the three loans have been repaid and the $3^{\text {rd }}$ will be paid in full in April 2023. Once the loan is repaid, we will be reinvesting it into another loan as Denise is researching new loans on the website. The Juniors love this project because it helps other woman outside our country improve their families' lives and we sometimes received updates from the women.

## Project Title: Memorial Day Wreath Presentation

 Hours 2 Donated \$ 116 In Kind \$Juniors joined the city of San Clemente's Memorial Day ceremony held at the community center on May 30, 2022. The event is to commemorate fallen soldiers of war. The ceremony includes speeches by city council members and chief of police, among others. The juniors donated a beautiful floral wreath with the club's colors; red and white. Unfortunately, the club was unable to attend the ceremony, but several members visited the site later that weekend.

## Project Title: Senior Center Rummage Sale_Hours_4_Donated \$___In Kind \$___

In a continued effort to support the San Clemente Senior Center, the San Clemente Junior Woman's Club lead by Denise Jusko organized a drive to support the Senior Center Rummage Sale on 8/6/22 to raise money for the Meals on Wheels program. Our members donated gently used household items such as dishware, clothing, knickknacks, purses, home décor and other items. Since COVID the center has a greater need to help the older community who are unable to leave their residences and our club feels this is a way to help support a need in our community.

The San Clemente Junior Woman's Club partnered with Words of Comfort Hope \& Promise to collect items for the troops Christmas stockings that start with the letter C , which were to go into care packages for troops serving overseas during the holiday. The drive was part of Operation Christmas Care Packages to create care packages for military personnel overseas who are unable to spend Christmas with their families. Members collected cookies, Christmas cards, cup o noodles, and candy canes. The donations were dropped off at their office in Laguna Niguel and members were invited to help stuff and box the stockings. Juniors feel this is an important project to support our troops and families as we are just north of Camp Pendleton.
