Tustin is a quaint cit founded in the 1800's. It prides itself in actively working with Non-Profits/Veterans and has a reputation of being a leader in Education. It is located in Orange County, California and has a population of 82,224 as of the 2022 Census. It was ranked 12th in the top 25 cities to line in (in America) by Fortune Magazine in 2022. The Tustin Area Woman's Club (TAWC) has been serving the community since 1958 and membership includes ladies between 40 to 100+ years of age. TAWC provides its members with a variety of activities, both philanthropic and self-enriching.

Project Title Young Woman of the Month Hours 100 Donated \$ 550 In Kind \$ 0

TAWC recognizes three high school seniors, one from each of the three participating Tustin high schools each month during the academic year as the TAWC Young Woman of the Month.

The purpose of the program is to recognize outstanding high school seniors and provide them with the opportunity to demonstrate their public speaking skills ad for TAWC to support and honor the winners. The TAWC Young Woman of the Month program is administered in partnership with the TAWC YWOM committee and each of the high school's counseling teams. Each high school counselor contact is provided with the dates the YWOM winners will be invited to our General Meeting. The high school counseling team selects the winner each month and communicates the honoree's name to the TAWC representative. During the winter and spring of 2022, the honoree would supply TAWC with a photography and biography covering her high school accomplishments, extracurricular activities and plans for the future. During the YWOM segment of our monthly General Meeting the YWOM Committee would display the honoree's picture and read her biography. This was a result of school COVID protocols not allowing students to leave campus to attend our meeting. In the Fall of 2022 we have been able to once again have the YWOM winner attend our General Meeting in person and present her biography. We are delighted that several of the honoree's parents have atte4nded the meetings as well. After the winner presents her biography, she is presented with a certificate and a gift acknowledging her accomplishment. The winner's picture and summary of her biography is published in our member newsletter, the TAWC TALK.

The Tustin Community Foundation holds an annual "Superhero" Luncheon and Auction which honors outstanding leadership from each of the community service organizations. Twenty-six members, family and friends attended to honor TAAWC's 2 Superhero Recipients.

The Members of the club headed up the Auction Table the day of the event which included setting up the auction, passing out Gift Bags, selling raffle tickets and clean up. Over \$675 was raised for the Tustin Community Foundation.

The members of the club also gathered items from members and the community to prepare 40 Gift Bags for the recipients.
