Project Title Christmas Toys for Girls & Boys Hours 10 Donated In-Kind \$1,500 The Fullerton Fire Department collected toys and gifts for the community. The WCOF helped the Fullerton Fire Department by donating \$1,500 in toys and gifts in support of the Holiday Toy Drive. Three Club members had fun shopping for the toys and met with the Fire Department to drop off the donations. It was great fun seeing the Fire Fighters in the firehouse and all the great toys they collected, the meaning of giving during the holiday season became real!

Project Title Crittenton Angel Tree Hours 90 Donated In-Kind \$2,025

This is a project the members look forward to doing every year, knowing this will brighten the children's Christmas Day. It is always heartwarming to make children happy. Members are given a list of children's names and their Christmas wishes, then the ladies select as many gifts as they would like to purchase, and gift wrap each for children that might otherwise not have a gift on Christmas. This year we had forty-five members participate and all the gifts were dropped off at the home of our Helping Hands, Chair. On December 9th we presented the wrapped gifts to the director of Crittenton Services, Angel Christmas Tree Gifts.

Project Title Assistance League of Fullerton Hours 8 Donated \$300 In-Kind Members of the Woman's Club of Fullerton collected several bags of women's clothing, shoes, blouses, sweaters, pants, and handbags. We also collected numerous bags of gently used baby clothes and blankets, shoes, toys, and a double stroller. One donation consisted of two king-size comforters and pillows, pillowcases, and bathroom towels. The sales of these donations will be 100% returned to the local community. Clothing assistance for those in need is provided. New clothes to over one thousand needy school children. They provide vision screening and referrals for over six thousand local school children.
