The WCOF collected forty-three dresses, nine fancy shoes, and \$750.00 for the YWCA. The YWCA picked twenty-four girls to sponsor and organized a quinceanera party for all the girls and their families. The girls were provided with dresses, hair, make-up, dance lessons, and much more. The dresses will also be used for PROM. For many of the young girls PROM and quinceanera dresses are difficult to afford, but the YWCA gives the young girls a chance to enjoy their birthdays and celebrate their youth.
