From Jan to May the President would read a quote from the book "Placentia Round Table Women's Club, the First Century, published in 2010 to inform the members present some of the unique challenges faced by the members during the early years of the club, which she called "Did You Know?"

Since March is Women's History Month, the women's history chair talked more about the club's history and recognized Jean Christensen for 75 years of service and read the names of 16 ladies who had been members since the early 70's. She also discussed some of the major projects over these years.

At the April meeting, a former Placentia resident, Corrie Ten Boom was celebrated and her dedication to hiding and helping Jews escape the Nazi's in Amsterdam. She was sent to Ravenbruck Prison and after the war formed a foundation to help camp survivors find homes and located displaced relatives.

In Mary, Mary Agnes Hallaren, the first woman to command a battalion of WAC's during World War 2 was recognized for determination to have women be incorporated into the regular army.

The June meeting which was the installation of new officers, members were reminded of early installations and some of the things that did not go as planned!

The incoming Presidents theme for the year is "Strike up the Band", and at the October meeting, it was interesting for all to learn about the lack of female band directors in our county. According to the directory, "Women in Music, only 32 women are listed as band directors nationwide.
