The City of La Habra is bedroom community with a population just over 65,000 residents. It is located in the very Northwest corner of Orange County. With no freeway access there is very little manufacturing in the city and the larger retailers have just recently begun to build here. La Habra Woman's Club was established in 1898 and has continued to be an asset of the community since.

Project Title: Scholarships Hours: 20 Donated: \$3,000 In Kind: -0-

The city of La Habra has 3 high schools that service our students. Two public and one private. It has been a tradition for more than 60 years that we award a student from each of the three schools a scholarship. This year each scholarship was for \$1,000. We work directly with the school's guidance office to disseminate the scholarship application to interested students. The application is open to those who plan on attending a trade school/program, a junior college, or a university. Once the committee has read and chosen the winners we invite them and their families to attend a small certificate presentation in our clubhouse. We serve refreshments and get to know a little bit more about our winners. A representative from the committee also attends each school's Senior Awards Night to present their award in front of their Senior class. Each school allows for Community Scholarships to give their awards. It is nice to be able to recognize them in front of their teachers and peers.

Project Title: Wilma Santana Memorial Scholarship Hours: 7 Donated: \$1,500 In Kind: -0-

In August of 2021 we lost long time member and friend Wilma Santana. She was a dedicated and decorated teacher and administrator and had tons of people in our community who loved her. Because of her lifelong dedication to education, her children requested that in lieu of flowers people send donations to the La Habra Woman's Club. The family wanted a scholarship created in her name. That is exactly what we did. As donations came in we kept a record of those funds specifically for Wilma's scholarship. The family wanted the scholarship to go to a student who was seeking a career in education. It was an honor to be able to present the scholarship to the winner.

Project Title: John Muir Charter School Holiday Lunch Hours: 25 Donated: \$1,250 In Kind:-0-

The City of La Habra in conjunction with the County of Orange manages a program for students who, for various reasons, do not attend traditional school. They range in age from 16-24. These students enroll in the program in hopes of getting their high school diploma. There are currently 20 students enrolled. In years past we have provided much needed support to the local elementary schools and our work has been appreciated. But when we learned of this program, we thought it would be nice to support a group that is often missed during the holidays as much of the concentration is toward a younger population. After much discussion and a vote, it was decided we would provide the students with lunch and a gift card. We worked

directly with the program leaders to decide the best ways we could support the students. We decorated our club house and ordered food to be brought in. We went out and purchased \$50 gift cards for each student. We put them in a small bag and hung them on a Christmas Tree. The students arrived by school bus and when they entered the room we really think they were surprised as we did an elaborate job decorating the room. We wanted them to feel special. We had lunch and after lunch we surprised them with the gift cards. They were taken aback and very appreciative. All in all it was a great afternoon and we hope to support these students in the future.
